



Fairway and WaterProtect

- The two projects are financed by the EU under the topic:
- **RUR-04-2016**: Water Farms improving farming and its impact on the supply of drinking water
- EU Contribution: 5 Million Euros approx. for each project
- Start date (both projects): 1 June 2017

Expected impact of the topic

- good cooperation between stakeholders on pesticides, fertilisers and irrigation management practices capable of reducing point source and diffuse pollution in different contexts;
- harmonised datasets on pesticide and fertiliser contamination of the drinking-water resources;
- greater involvement of farmers and other citizens in the monitoring of water quality;
- water governance models that are more conductive to the adoption and long-term durability of efficient on-farm and land-use strategies;
- integrated scientific support for relevant EU policies (e.g. Common Agricultural Policy, Water Framework Directive, sustainable use of pesticides).



Tips for successful communication

- Projects with a policy dimension
 - → Ensure a two-way communication with the EC policy services through the project officer
- Impact on society and links to stakeholders
 - → Engage with interested parties at EU/national or local level from the projects' start so your results can be widely shared & used
- Synergies between FairWay and WaterProtect
 - → Joint activities (such as this event) are most welcome Other R&I initiatives are taking place at EU level on water management (EIP-Water, European Water Partnership, other EU projects, etc) so complementarities can be further developed

How to disseminate your results?

- EIP-AGRI platform: gateway to wider community
 - ✓ Promotional tools (website, online newsletter, publications, etc)
 - ✓ Dedicated Focus Groups (one on water & agriculture)
 - ✓ Links to Operational groups funded under CAP
- Share your results in an understandable language for users
 - ✓ EIP-AGRI Practice abstract: common format for all H2020 multi-actor projects and operational groups (searchable online database)

Multi-Actor Approach (MAA)

"The multi-actor approach aims at more demand-driven innovation through the genuine and sufficient involvement of various actors (end-users such as farmers/farmers' groups, fishers/fisher's groups, advisors, enterprises, etc.) all along the project: from the participation in the planning of work and experiments, their execution up until the dissemination of results and a possible demonstration phase."

(Work Programme 2016-2017)

→ The multi-actor approach aims to improve impact through co-creation between different types of actors (scientific and non-scientific)

Funding for interactive innovation projects

Rural Development, (regional/national level)

- Funding for <u>setting up</u> of an "Operational Group" (OG): farmers, advisors, agribusiness, researchers, NGOs, etc) <u>planning an innovation project</u> (Art 35)
- Project funding for the Operational Group's project (Art 35).
- Supporting <u>innovation</u> <u>support services</u>
